As leader of an organization for the care of people living with albinism in the DRC (Corbetta RDC) and of the network of organizations of people living with albinism in Central Africa (ROPAC) we will put our contribution to GlobalSkin our skills in terms of organization of training campaigns for health providers, families of patients and the patients themselves, in the organization of outpatient care and awareness-raising methods.
