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Global Research on the Impact of Dermatological Diseases (GRIDD)



Dermatological diseases can have substantial physical, psychological and social impact on patients^{1,2}



Often goal of dermatology is to improve quality of life rather than cure the condition



Most impact data comes from PROMs \bigcirc


No dermatology-specific PROM meets COSMIN criteria to be recommended for use



Patient-Reported Impact of Dermatological Disease (PRIDD) development



Content validity is considered the most important measurement property³



First step in content validity phase is the development of a conceptual framework⁴



Item generation should be based on qualitative research^{3,4}

Aim: To develop a conceptual framework of the impact of dermatological conditions on patients' lives




